“Methadone and Buprenorphine: Review and Update”

Doug Bovee, M.D.

Presentation: This presentation is a review of addictive disease with a focus on opioid dependency and opioid agonist therapy. With that context Dr. Bovee will discuss the pharmacology and therapeutics of methadone and buprenorphine for both pain and addiction. Dr. Bovee will highlight the risks as well as benefits of the two drugs.

Speaker: Dr. Bovee graduated from the University of Miami School of Medicine in 1978 after attending pharmacy school at the University of Florida. He completed his internship at the Public Health Service Hospital in San Francisco and residency in internal medicine at the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque. After working in a hospital based addiction treatment program in Seattle, he moved to Eugene in 1992, where he became a full time addiction medicine physician for Serenity Lane. Since 1997, he has worked in two methadone clinics and is the former Medical Director at Integrated Health Clinic of Eugene and Prevention and Recovery Northwest. He acquired an adult medicine practice in 1999 and now practices internal medicine and addiction medicine at South Hilyard Clinic. He was recertified in 1996 as expert in Addiction Medicine and achieved fellowship in the American College of Physicians in 1992 and the American Society of Addiction Medicine in 1998. He is president of the board of Lane Independent Primary Physicians.

- Distinguish between methadone and buprenorphine for pain and addiction.
