

“Microcurrent Positional Tuina (MPT) for Neck Pain”
with
Malvin Finkelstein, O.M.D., L.Ac., Dipl. O.M.

Presentation: Neck pain is a common medical problem that can be caused by repetitive motion injuries in the workplace, at home and in recreation, as well as from traumas such as Motor Vehicle Accidents. This lecture will explain the use of ETPS Microcurrent and Positional Tuina (Chinese Massage) as an effective treatment for Neck Pain. The demonstration will illustrate the quick release of tension and improvement of range of motion.

Malvin Finkelstein, O.M.D., L. Ac., Dipl. O.M. has been practicing acupuncture and Oriental medicine for more than 30 years in Eugene, Oregon. He has taught acupuncture, acupressure, qigong and MPT in the U.S. and Europe and is the author of two books and a qigong DVD. He is currently writing another book: Qigong for Postural Alignment. Malvin is the chairperson of the Oregon Board of Medicine's Acupuncture Committee on which he has served for 20 years; former chairperson of the NCCAOM (National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine) and the NQA (National Qigong Association); and former president of the PSO (Pain Society of Oregon) and the OAA (Oregon Acupuncture Association).
